Call to Order Kasey Bozeman

President Kasey Bozeman called the meeting to order at 10:01am. The meeting was held at Rock Eagle 4-H center.

Kasey asked to amend the agenda to allow Dr. Laura Perry Johnson speak and give updates from UGA.

Dr. Laura Perry Johnson

- Thank you to Kate for sending a schedule to speak to all the groups at the JCEP meeting today. Kate is the JCEP chair and she is doing a great job. It is very organized and well run. JCEP will be going to Washington in a few weeks to represent Extension
- Kasey and Kate have been excellent leadership for this group. Thank you for your organization and proactive vison
- Budget- in the late 30s of the 40 day session. The legislative session must be finished by March 30th. The budget will go to the conference committee but it's not over until the Governor signs the budget. Things are looking positive so far. I am feeling 90% positive that all of our requests will stay in there.
- Jack Hill did report that this is the first downturn in economic reports. All of the tax refunds that were going out in February caused revenues to go down. History shows that it goes up and down.
- Feels confident that funding for the 5 specialist will stay in the budget. Full maintenance and operation money (6.2 million) went in the budget on the house side. Please don't fuss at your Senators, be pleasant © Small caps project (5 million or below). Extension asked for 5 million to support the poultry science renovations.
- 4.2 million experiment stations, 2 million to Extension (4-H centers, Hoke Smith, Ag Services, Tifton Campus Rural Development center, Griffin, Hoke Smith Annex). We really need this funding. Won't necessarily support new positions but would help with funding the positions
- Agent positions have done really well in the past few years in the legislature. It has to be important to ALL agents that we do a great job with the money that we have because it impacts everyone at the state and local level. It helps us to promote our programs at the capitol.
- Unrest at the Federal level- we get 10% of our funding from the Federal government. 8 million in Smith Lever Funds. Federal funding really hits the specialist and operating money at the Extension level.
- Capacity funds- base funds that helps us to have someone in place when a something comes up like a drought, pest issues, helps with us to redirect staff to work on those issues.

- Concerned most about the federal money. If we lost that it would be hard to recover from them.
 - Would include ag funding, AmeriCorps, and EFNEP.
 - o Be prepared to be able to articulate how important these funds are at the local level
- Chairing the search for the Associate Dean for Research. This will be a very important position. They will manage all of the experiment station funds.
- Hired 3 department heads last year
 - Poultry Science
 - o Entomology
 - Plant Pathology
- This year hiring 3 new department heads
 - ALEC
 - o Animal and Dairy Science
 - Crop and Soil Science
- Many changes going on with lots of new faces
- We are hoping to hire an Evaluation Specialist
- Everything we do we should have the end goal and impact in mind

Policy & Resolution

- 1. Membership eligibility committee and proposal
 - a. In December 2016, GAE4-HA President, Kasey Bozeman, tasked an appointed Membership Eligibility Committee to thoroughly review the current GAE4-HA by-laws that define our four membership classes. As Chair of the Policy and Resolution Committee, I was asked to serve as chair of this committee. Following this task, the committee (comprised of Al Parker, Julie-Lynne Macie, Kate Whiting, Sonya Jones, Lynn Hall, and Phillip Petway) met twice to review GAE4-HA membership feedback regarding recent changes in classifications of Extension employees.

Based on feedback from the current GAE4-HA membership as well as data from the CAES Business Office, the committee proposed to better define the current by-laws that outline "Active Membership". In an effort to provide 4-H faculty and staff throughout the state the opportunity to engage in a professional development association, the following clarification is being proposed to GAE4-HA membership to review and then vote upon at our upcoming state meeting (proposed clarification is in red).

"Active Members: Currently employed *full time* by University of Georgia Cooperative Extension and Fort Valley State University Extension in professional status *(having 5 years' employed extension experience or a Bachelor's degree)* or operating under an official agreement with University of Georgia Cooperative Extension in a professional status *(having 5 years' employed extension experience or a Bachelor's degree)* and assigned responsibility for 4-H Youth development or professional interest in promoting and supporting same. Active GAE4-HA members who retire may complete that membership year as active members, with full membership benefits. They may vote; hold elected or appointed positions; receive newsletters, pay full current dues amount."

This clarification was proposed unanimously by the Membership Eligibility Committee to the GAE4-HA Board of Directors. On Monday, the Board of Directors voted and passed this proposal to move forward to the larger membership for a vote at the state meeting. As a committee, and even further as Board of Directors, we hope this clarification better defines individuals who are eligible to engage in GAE4-HA as active members (this discussion is not bound narrowly to confuse membership with participation in state meetings, but rather their engagement in the association as a whole as anyone is eligible to register for our annual state meeting). Our overall hope was to provide a more stable and broad look at membership eligibility regardless of job title (since we have seen these change often based on federal and state legislation the past few years).

- 2. Review and update of financial policies
 - a. Financial policies as well as procedure documents were created and proposed to the GAE4-HA Board of Directors (see attached)
- 3. Annual meeting exhibit fair and educational posters
 - a. We are still accepting applications for the GAE4-HA Annual Meeting and exhibit fair. A call for proposals and applications was sent to membership in March.
