Some plants are over 3' high, so we recommend pick-up in a truck if you have trees in your order. Payment accepted by cash or check (Made payable to Tattnall County Ext.\4-H). If special arrangements are needed for pick-up, they must be pre-scheduled with the Extension staff. No refunds will be given for plants that are not picked up by the assigned pick-up date.
