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# WHAT TO BRING AND DRESS CODE

Youth (and parents) should complete the Medical Information and Release Form, Medicine Form (if bringing medicine to the event), 4-H Code of Conduct and send these documents with the county chaperone. For Georgia 4-H Medical Information Instructions, visit: http://georgia4h.org/documents/MedicationInformationInstructions.pdf

Participants should bring clothing as specified in the State 4-H Council dress code, appropriate swimwear, twin sheets/sleeping bag, and toiletries for the weekend. Participants may also need to bring money for meals on the road and may also choose to bring optional spending money for district t-shirts and concessions available at the Rock Eagle Canteen and evening recreations.

Friday	Comfortable modest dress including shorts, t-shirts, and tennis shoes.
Saturday	District Iron Clover t-shirt and shorts with comfortable shoes. Comfortable, modest dress including shorts, t-shirts, and tennis shoes.
Sunday	Better school clothes, including long pants, collared shirts, capri pants, shirts, and dresses; no shorts, t-shirts, or tennis shoes.

4-H'ers are to leave radios, computers, electronic devices, fit bits, valuable watches, and video games at home unless authorized by and used under direct supervision of the member's leader. 4-H'ers are discouraged from bringing cell phones to camp and events. 4-H'ers should not use cell phones after lights out. No programs are to be disturbed or interrupted by use of personal electronic equipment. 4-H'ers are not allowed to bring skates, roller blades, bicycles, laser lights or other personal items that would make safety an issue. 4-H'ers are discouraged from bringing excessive amounts of money to 4-H events. Georgia 4-H and 4-H Centers assume no responsibility for lost, stolen or damaged items of value including cell phones or money that are brought to 4-H activities.

## **TRANSPORTATION**

Transportation to State 4-H Council will be provided. Our expected departure time will be at 10 a.m. on Friday. Please bring money to stop for lunch on the way to Rock Eagle. Return time will be approximately 3 p.m. on Sunday. You will need money for lunch on the way home on Sunday. Final details about departure time will be sent out as soon as registration has closed for the event. Mrs. Rebekah Greene, Tattnall County 4-H Agent, will serve as the primary adult chaperone for the Tattnall County 4-H delegation.

# **ILLNESS POLICY**

If a 4-H'er arrives at a 4-H event/activity with an untreated contagious illness or is diagnosed at the event with a contagious illness, a parent/guardian will be asked to pick them up immediately. The parent/guardian will also be contacted if the child has a fever to determine the course of action. Contagious illnesses could include, but are not limited to head lice, pink eye, mononucleosis, strep throat, flu, or ring worm.



#### **SERVICE LEADERS**

Each delegate attending State Council will attend the community service fair as one of their scheduled workshops. During this time, selected 4-H'ers will have the opportunity to lead a community service activity. Community service projects should be easy to do in a short time frame and provide something for a group in need. Examples are letters to military families or 4-H donors, decorations for a senior center, caps for cancer patients, etc. Selected service leaders must supply materials. If selected, service leaders will need to be present to lead their service project during all four of the workshops scheduled at State Council.

# GEORGIA 4-H STATE BOARD OF DIRECTORS NOMINATIONS & VOTING DELEGATES

Any 4-H'ers in the 9<sup>th</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup> grade in the 2018-2019 school year interested in submitting an application for the Georgia 4-H Board of Directors (State Officers) should complete the State 4-H Officer Nomination Packet.

As reflected in the Georgia 4-H Constitution, amended June 23, 2018, "Only candidates who have submitted their application by the selected deadline are eligible to seek election to the Georgia 4-H State Board of Directors. Nominations from the floor will not be recognized."

The deadline for applications to be received in the state 4-H office is Wednesday, June 12, 2019.

Completed applications must be approved by and signed by your County Extension Staff prior to submission to the State 4-H Office. Deadline to complete this process with the Tattnall County Extension Staff is May 29<sup>TH</sup>!

According to the Georgia 4-H Constitution... "the maximum number <of voting delegates> will be determined by the district with the largest number of counties times four votes." With 41 counties, Southwest District currently holds the largest number of counties in our four Extension districts. This means the total number of voting delegates per district is **164 votes per district**.

If you have a strong interest in serving as a voting delegate this year, please let Mrs. Rebekah know when you sign up for State Council. She will assign voting delegates based on our allowed number, 4-H'er age, and interest.



# **IRON CLOVER COMPETITION**

The annual Iron Clover Competition is held at State 4-H Council. This event takes its name from the iron statue of the 4-H emblem currently standing in front of Sutton Hall at Rock Eagle and is designed to commemorate the statewide competition. During the competition, each district competes against one another in fun competitions, ranging from softball to musical chairs. At the end of the weekend, the district team that has been awarded the most Iron Clover points has won the title of "Iron Clover Champion" for their district.

Sign-ups for the Iron Clover competition will take place at State 4-H Council during Saturday morning district assemblies prior to the Iron Clover Rally. The winner of the Iron Clover competition will be announced during the Sunday morning closing assembly.
