(*Pyrus calleryana*)

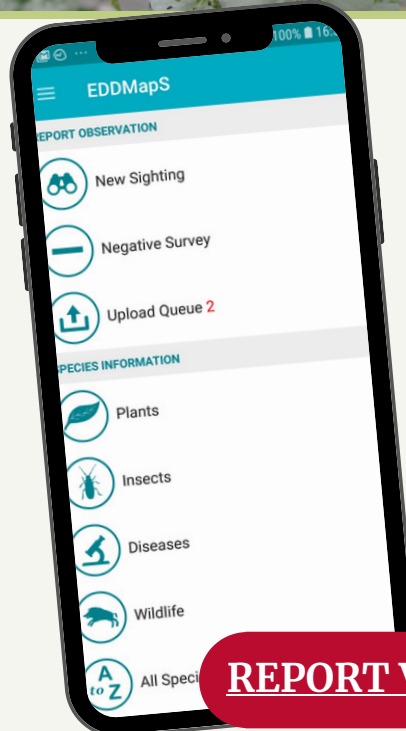
Tree invading the whole US

## leatherleaf mahonia

(*Mahonia bealei*)

Shrub invading the SE US  
Flowering early Spring  
Spiny leaves and waxy fruit

### PLANT THIS

Eastern redbud (*Cercis canadensis*)

- Tolerant of urban conditions
- Showy flowers
- Small size
- Many cultivars available



Callery (Bradford) pear (*Pyrus calleryana*)

NOT THAT



- Poor structure- prone to breakage
- Flowers small/terrible
- Hybridizes in nature, producing fertile fruit and crowding out native trees

#### Cut Wood Vectors and Pathways

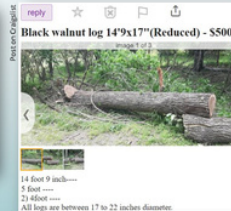
Pests and invasive species can live in/on trees and can spread hundreds of miles away when wood is moved for firewood, woodworking, etc.

#### Firewood



Firewood is a major pathway of spread.

#### Woodworking



Pests are not easily visible through the bark.

#### Prevention Methods

- ✓ Know the laws on moving wood.
- ✓ Contact your county extension agent for information.
- ✓ Buy firewood where you burn it, gather locally if permitted, and/or buy state or federal certified heat-treated firewood.
