

Georgia 4-H reviews youth applications on an annual basis for membership for the Georgia 4-H Technology Summit Planning Team for the 4-H program year (August – July). Each application is reviewed by a team of adult and collegiate leaders using the criteria below. The 4-H'ers basic identifying information (name, county, etc.) will be withheld on the reviewer's application packet. Therefore, the reviewer will not know the name of the 4-H member they are evaluating.

Application Scoring Rubric

Desire to Join Team 15 points

The applicant shares their desire to join the Technology Summit Planning Team, their interest in technology-related projects, and the current skills they could utilize as part of the team.

Goals 15 points

The applicant demonstrates thoughtful personal goals for their Technology Summit Planning Team membership.

Leadership Ideas & Time Management 15 points

The applicant provides thoughtful contributions about their leadership ideas as well as how they will manage their time and responsibilities.

4-H Leader Reference 15 points

The 4-H leader listed on the 4-H'ers application will complete a short, online reference form. The reference form will ask the 4-H leader to assess the 4-H'ers following skills: dependability, organized, trustworthy, ability to work on teams, responsibility, responsiveness, ability to interact with adults well, and the ability to interact with peers well.

Effort will be made to ensure the planning team is comprised of diverse 4-H youth representing various ages, backgrounds, and experiences.

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
