YOUTH LIVESTOCK JUDGING CONTEST

Contest is scheduled for Thursday, September 15th at 4:00 p.m. with registration beginning at 3:30 p.m.

The contest will begin at the Northwest Georgia Livestock Pavilion at 1286 Highway 53 Spur SW in Calhoun, GA. Following the classes and questions, reasons, official critiques, and awards ceremony will take place at the Northwest Georgia Regional Fairgrounds at 1060 Liberty Rd SW, Calhoun, GA 30701.

- ◆ All individuals must be pre-registered by September 14 using the online entry form at this link: https://ugeorgia.ca1.qualtrics.com/ife/form/SV OPM43iEcVN0rOFE.
- There are no entry fees required for participants.
- All registered contestants arrive by 3:30 p.m. on the day of contest as we will start at 4:00 p.m.
- There will be both a Junior (4th-8th grade) and Senior Division (9th-12th grade).
- Individuals will judge six classes. There will also be one EPD class and one set of questions for both juniors and seniors. Seniors will give one set of reasons.
- Ten minutes will be allowed for judging each class.
- 4-H and FFA show animals will be used sparingly. Every effort will be made to assemble fair classes of animals that have not been previously exhibited.
- This will be an individual only contest. There will be no team scores calculated and no team awards.
- Awards will be given to the top 5 individuals in each of the two Divisions, Junior and Senior.
- Individual awards will be given as follows:

first tie - highest score on question session
