



Mission Make-It Teen Leader Application Scoring Rubric

The Georgia 4-H Mission Make-It program accepts applications for high school youth (9th-12th grade) to serve as Teen Leaders during the event. Teen Leaders are paired with adult leaders and co-lead two educational workshops. Additionally, they are required to bring a STEM-related educational exhibit to display. Teen leaders must complete the Georgia 4-H Certified Teen Leader training prior to the event. Each application is reviewed by a team of adult leaders using the criteria below. The 4-H's basic identifying information (name, county, etc.) will be withheld on the reviewer's application packet. Therefore, the reviewer will not know the name of the 4-H member they are evaluating.

Application Scoring Rubric

4-H Participation 10 points

The applicant outlines their current 4-H involvement and participation.

4-H STEM Programming Accomplishments 20 points

The applicant demonstrates strong 4-H accomplishments related to science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.

Experience Teaching Workshops 15 points

The applicant has experience teaching workshops, classes, clinics, etc.

Experience Teaching STEM Programming 20 points

The applicant has experience specifically teaching programming related to science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.

Experience with Middle School Students 20 points

The applicant has direct experience working with middle school students. Middle school students are the target audience of this event.

Desire to Serve 15 points

The applicant shares their desire to serve as a Teen Leader during the event and why the opportunity is important to the applicant.
