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# ANR Updates

- The ANR Agent, Ashley Best, is developing a new blog for the Newton Extension Office showcasing different topics that focus on Newton County agriculture. Topics include but are not limited to homeowner grass maintenance, gardening, hay production, beef cattle and backyard poultry. Expected release date is April 10th.
- Newton Extension has a new Instagram (@uga\_extension\_newton) and will be doing Virtual Tours occasionally on the story feature. Posts include updates for COVID-19, service updates, ag facts, and much more.
- Ashley Best has been **training** via zoom in **ANR** Foundations as well as Forages to meet the needs of Newton County. She has been learning about plant pathology, basic pond management, conducting field visits, veterinary diagnostics, pecan growing, and forestry programming. She has also completed CEC Training on Policies, Procedures and Practices.

## 4-H Update

- Newton 4-H wrapped up **Project Achievement** in March. On a Cloverleaf level (4th-6th grade), we saw a 100% increase in county-level projects with 373 competing in the public speaking competition! Fifty-four competed at district competition, which was hosted by Newton 4-H at Newton High with an estimated 1000 people in attendance from 12 counties. For Juniors and Seniors (7th-12th grades), 14 youth completed annual 4-H portfolios and presented public speaking demonstrations, cooking demonstrations, or musical performances. Delaney Millerick won second in Festive Foods for Health and will move on to State 4-H Congress with her demonstration on seafood & sushi.
- Camp registration opened for Cloverleaf Camp (4th-6th grades), Marine Resources camps (6th-8th grades), Wilderness Challenge Camp (6th-8th grades), Junior Camp (7th-8th grades), Senior Extreme Camp (9th-12th grades), Senior Camp (9th-12th grades) and Music Education Matters Summit (6th-12th grades). Additionally, state scholarships were secured for youth at the Newton Boys & Girls Club (3 youth for Senior Camp) and Washington Street Community Center (4 youth & 1 adult for Cloverleaf Camp) to attend at only \$25 each. Forty-eight youth are currently registered.
- Newton 4-H member Ella Prosser of Indian Creek Middle School was elected by Northwest District 4-H members to serve on the **2020-2021 Junior Board of Directors**.
- Livestock Team member Gracie Woodward of Indian Creek Middle School won a heifer from the Georgia Junior Cattlemen's Heifer Allotment Youth (HAY) program.
- Northwest District Special Awards were presented to Newton 4-H'ers Delaney Millerick (Best Project Club for her cooking club) and CJ Harris (Best Community Service Project for the STEAM Team's day camp, community programming and scholarship to another county).
